

Project Due:

- A. Be sure to keep a log of your time spent reading this book.
- B. Write twenty questions you think anyone who reads your book should be able to answer. They can be true/false, multiple choice, or short answer questions that require some writing. Your questions should be from the beginning, middle, and end of the book. Remember to use what, where, how, when, who, and why in your questions.
- C. Write the title of your book at the top of your question page.
- D. Put the answers on another sheet of paper.
- E. Make sure your name and book title are on both sheets.
- F. This project can be typed or <u>neatly</u> handwritten. Also, include in your report the following:
 - 1. Summary:

Please give a short summary of the book. This summary will include the important facts and events in the book. What is the main action in the book? Who does it involve? What problem or problems are the characters trying to solve? How do they solve them?

2. Vocabulary Words:

Please list five new vocabulary words from your story. Write a definition for each word.

3. Opinion:

Please give your opinion of the story. Was it interesting? What did you like or dislike about the book? Would you recommend the book to other students in the class? Would you read other books by the same author?

G. Be prepared to give an oral summary of the book. Be familiar with the characters, setting, problem and solution.
